

Not to mention the big shed (20 metres X 10 metres) with 4 car spaces, part concreted with one space enclosed.

With two main and one auxiliary tank whose overflow is gravity fed to the dam, which reduces the need for pumps and therefore electric power., and the fire-fighting outlets which are also gravity fed reduce fire risk.

There is a bungalow on the property that is fully fitted. The main room has a magnificent Open Fireplace, and for a quick burst of heat, there is a split-system air-conditioner.

Everything about this property is truly beautiful....and the most stunning of all is the log cabin. This is something to write home about.

It epitomizes rustic artisan architecture. The great slabs of railway sleepers that have been made into benches and cupboards and then finished with a high-gloss epoxy resin. The spacious pantry and the upright 4 burner cooker is practical, but the freestanding ESSE woodburning combustion oven is an absolute dream.
